Secrets & Tactics for Catching Selective Trout

With Landon Mayer

Did you know that during a battle with a gorgeous trout you can actually let your line go slack to prevent the fish from running through roots and structure, which would certainly cause him to break off? And did you also know that there are times when it is best for you to “un-match the hatch?” And did you know casting with a motion that, when you were learning to cast, your instructor told you to never use could today actually help you? The key to becoming a better angler is to try to learn something new on the water every day. In this first of our new year’s presentations, you will take a journey through Landon Mayer’s 20 years of personal guide notes in which he details some of his most important tips and tricks, helping you achieve the quality results that he himself often enjoys on the water.

With his easy to understand, step-by-step teaching approach, Landon and his out-of-the-box tactics and techniques have proven to work throughout the U.S. and beyond. Highlights in his program include photos, videos and a special guide fly “recipe” that are sure to make your next adventure a success. For example, Landon will take you through each motion in a supposedly “incorrect” cast that would help solve what could be a difficult situation. Combining visual elements of the angler and his or her movements, the water and its movements and the trout’s feeding behavior – all this knowledge and understanding can help advance every angler to the next skill level. There is no one whose “secret” notes and many years of experience can help us more than Landon Mayer.

Landon was born and raised in Colorado Springs where he began his fly fishing career in the 6th grade when his middle school offered fly casting lessons. Throughout his teens, Landon’s love of the sport grew when he spent all his free time hanging around local fly shops and watching VHS tapes by Gary Borger and Doug Swisher until the tapes actually wore out!

After graduating high school, Landon pursued a career as a full time guide in Colorado, learning from great Colorado anglers such as Ed Engle, Pat Dorsey and fly tyer John Barr. He also spent one year guiding in Alaska on the Naknek River. During this

Fly Rod & Reel, High Country Angler, Southwest Fly Fishing and American Angler.

Passion and love for the sport are what motivates Landon and drives him to continually learn more and perfect his fly fishing skills. His success has also been fueled by an addiction to pursue large trout with small flies and lightweight fly fishing equipment. His travels take him to Mexico, Alaska, Belize and all around the United States where he constantly develops new and successful tactics.

In 2007, Landon's first book, *How to Catch the Biggest Trout of Your Life*, was published by Wild River Press, which was followed by his DVD *Landing the Trout of Your Life*. The next year, 2008, saw the release of his second DVD, *Weapons of Bass Production*. With his own guide service going full tilt, Landon went on to share even more techniques and secrets in his books *Sight Fishing for Trout* (Stackpole Books, 2010) and *Colorado's Best Fly Fishing* (Stackpole/Headwater Books, 2011). His latest book is *101 Trout Tips: A Guide's Secrets, Tactics and Techniques*. Landon will have his books and videos available for sale at his club appearance.

Landon is an ambassador for Simms fly fishing apparel and an advisory team member of Simms, Ross Reels, Scientific Anglers, Smith Optics, Fishpond luggage and accessories, Yeti coolers and Casio Pro Trek watches. Landon is also a royalty fly designer for Umpqua Feather Merchants.

Together with his wife Michelle (who shares his passion for the sport) and their four children, Landon continues to live near his home waters of the South Platte River in Colorado where he teaches fly fishing through guiding and fly fishing classes; he also appears around the country giving presentations of his innovative, successful and popular techniques. I wish do extend a personal message of gratitude to every Volunteer Member, Committee Chair, and BOD's within GSF, please accept this genuine expression of appreciation.

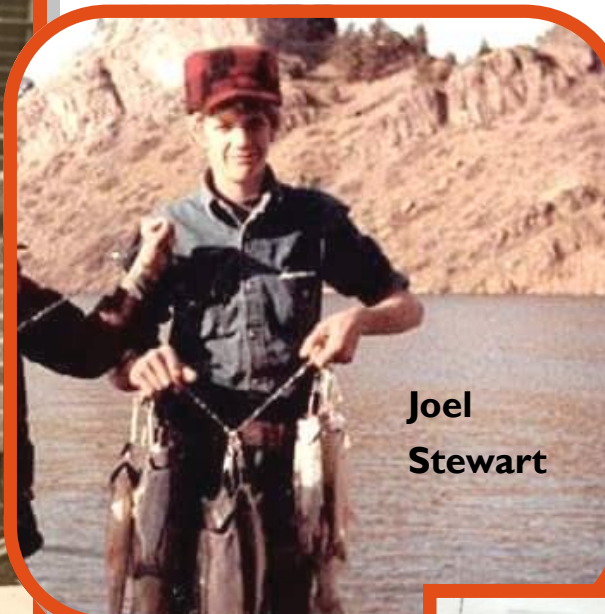

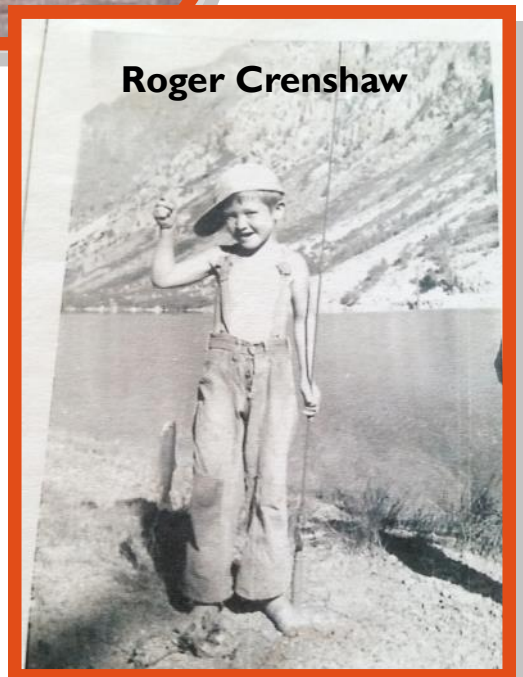

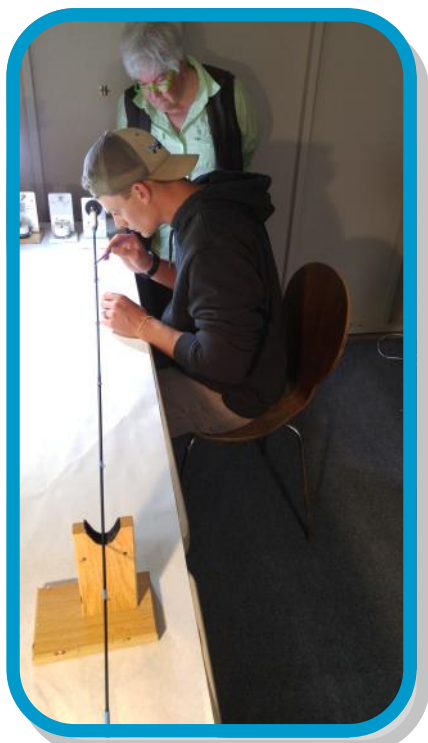

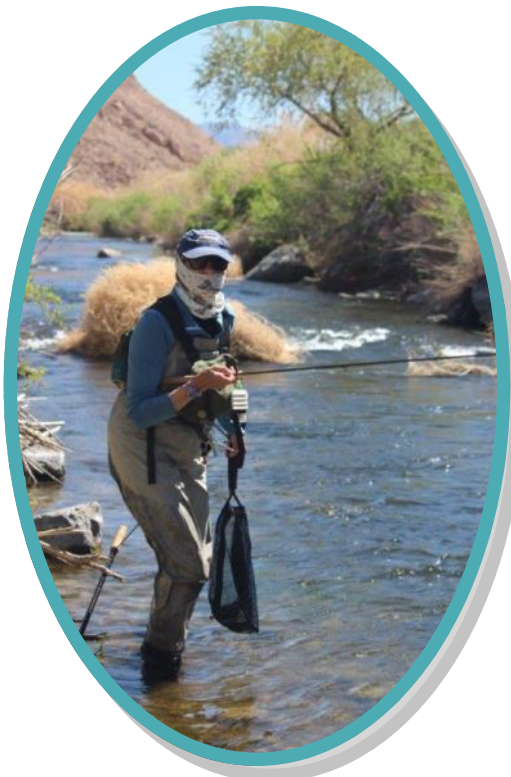
